## Believe and Achieve!

The Commission for the Blind and Visually Impaired (CBVI) provides Education Services to eligible children and their families from birth through high school graduation.

These services are designed to allow students who are visually impaired to participate equally with other students in all classroom activities.

A child is eligible for CBVI services if he or she has one of the following:

- Central visual acuity of 20/70 or worse in the better eye with best correction
- A visual field restriction of 40 degrees or less
- A rapidly progressing visual condition

Once a child is found eligible for services, CBVI works closely with the student, their family members and local school personnel.



CBVI Education Services are focused on Accessibility, Inclusion, and Integration and may include:

- Comprehensive itinerant services provided by a certified Teacher of the Visually Impaired (TVI)
- Training, for families of infants and toddlers with visual impairments
- Services for children with multiple disabilities and visual impairment
- Services for children who are identified as deaf-blind
- Provision of accessible books, materials, and equipment from the **George F. Meyer Instructional Resource Center**
- Instruction/training in the use of accessible books, materials, and equipment

## Additional CBVI Services

These services are also available to all students when appropriate:

- Training in skills of daily living including how to travel independently
- Eye Health Nursing Services
- High School Transition and Vocational Rehabilitation Services
- Summer Development Programs
