



5 Free Smartphone Apps for People with Vision Loss for Daily Use



BeMyEyes **Free**

Connects people with vision loss to sighted volunteers for assistance in daily tasks via a live video stream. Or take a photo and use their BeMyAI feature; an AI virtual assistant which describes the photo and allows the user to ask more questions or call a sighted volunteer if more assistance is needed. **Available for iOS and Android**

Seeing AI **Free**

Narrates the world around you. Recognizes objects, text, bar codes and people using smartphone camera and narrates back to the user. Read text, set summary, or ask questions about a document, and explore your photos or get a description of the scene in front of you. **Available for iOS and Android**

Spectrum Access **Free**

Provides audio descriptions and closed captioning for movies and television shows. Users do not have to be a Spectrum customer. **Available for iOS and Android**

EnvisionAI **Free**

Recognizes objects, people, barcodes, color, money, light, and gives scene descriptions. Reads text aloud with the ability to ask questions regarding the document, and even can translate into other languages. Pairs with Envision's smart glasses (for purchase). **Available for iOS and Android**

Rebokeh **Free**

Designed for people with mild to moderate vision impairment. Users create custom video filters and overlay them on a live camera feed to personalize the view to best suit their needs. **Available for iOS only**
